### ***\$3,000 invested in Six Nations Community by EDT through Emergency Relief Fund***

**SIX NATIONS, ON –November 30, 2020**– The Six Nations of the Grand River Economic Development Trust (EDT) is proud to announce the allocation of funds for the Second Call for EDT Emergency Relief Applications.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Six Nations EDT created a new application for on-reserve non-profit organizations that serve the Six Nations community. The Emergency Relief Fund was developed to support the safety and wellbeing of organizations in the community by providing financial support for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

The EDT received a total of 6 applications of which 3 were approved.

The funding will be used by the successful applicants to help them continue their activities safely while also complying with public health advice and other guidelines that will reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19.

The EDT has been investing in the collective betterment of the Six Nations Community since September 2016. EDT funds are made available through annual distributions of surplus profits by the Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC). These profits are a result of SNGRDC's operations both on and off reserve, including but not limited to, Six Nations Bingo, A6N Utilities, Six Nations Tourism, along with various investments in the renewable energy industry
